

Mercy flows... Love redeems

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Twenty-one years ago, on April 30, 2000, St. John Paul II canonized St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, declaring her as “the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time.” Since that time the Church has the option of celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday on this Second Sunday of Easter. Since that time, Divine Mercy Sunday has been a staple of every Second Sunday of Easter.

Anytime I preach on Divine Mercy Sunday, I remind everyone of us that this is the most progressive, forward looking “new” devotion the Church offers us. Why is that so? Well, this devotion calls its devotees (and indeed any of us who dare to call ourselves Christians) to reflect the merciful love of Christ in all we say and do. The phrase “have mercy on us, and on the **whole world**” is repeated 50 times during the praying of the Divine Mercy Chaplet! This mantra reminds us that we are praying not only for ourselves, but for every single soul created in the image and likeness of God, even those we find most difficult to love, even our enemies!

But the real challenge is for us who celebrate this Divine Mercy Sunday. If we pray that God “have mercy on us and on the **whole world**,” we, too, must reflect that same divine mercy, love, compassion, forgiveness for EVERYONE, without condition, without exception. Yepper...we’re called to have that same, unconditional love for everyone, regardless of who they are or where they stand in their own relationship with God, even if they have no relationship with God or even deny God.

We also must remain cautious that we, in the name of Divine Mercy, never appear to sit self-righteously in the judgement seat of God. The true and sincere disciple of Divine Mercy always admits the personal need for God’s mercy, and never points the finger at others. Humility before God and others is the authentic posture of anyone even remotely close to the divine and merciful heart of God.

I know I’ve got a lot of work to do in the humility area. I pray that every one of us will continuously and sincerely turn toward the Divine Mercy of God and show that by how we welcome, accept, value and cherish one another, all as sisters and brothers willed into existence **by** God alone, and **for** God who abides in the hearts of all his children.

I’d like to offer my sincere thanks to the vast majority of you who have expressed your gratitude for all that was done to make this past Holy Week and Easter such a wonderful experience of God’s conquering the darkness of sin and death with his own resurrected life, love and light!




Divine Mercy Devotion

Join us at **2:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 11 to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet** in the Church. Reservations are required and can be made at www.seaslv.org or 702-228-8311.

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

Doubt

The desire to be able to prove the existence of a divinity has troubled humanity since human consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that any number of things — from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes — are "proof that there is a God." We get so caught up in the story of "doubting Thomas" that we fail to notice that today's Gospel gives us John's account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps, makes Thomas' disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God — the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to Jesus Christ as "God" — more remarkable.

Saint of the Week

Saint Bernadette Soubirous

Dates: 1844 - 1879

Feast Day: April 16

As a child in a poor French family in the Hautes-Pyrenees town of Lourdes, Bernadette suffered both asthma and cholera. Uneducated, she had not made her first Communion by 1851, the year she experienced 18 visions of a beautiful lady calling herself the Immaculate Conception and calling for penance and pilgrimage. Bernadette was unchanged by this extraordinary experience, and in 1866 became a member of the Sisters of Charity, taking the name Maria-Bernarda. Chronically ill after 1875 with worsening asthma and tuberculosis of the bones, she died at age 35. When she was canonized in 1933, it was not for being the Lourdes visionary, but for her simple life of prayer, devotion and obedience.

Feast of Faith

The Psalms in the Liturgy

The book of Psalms is a prayer book, hymnal and anthology of verse all rolled into one. It contains one hundred fifty ancient songs — poem-prayers that express the joys and sorrows of the Hebrew people and their longing for God. The psalms are incredibly varied in tone. Some are solemn anthems of praise that once accompanied processions of great multitudes to the temple; others record the lonely cries of a faithful soul who feels abandoned by God.

This ancient prayer book of the Hebrew people is our principal prayer book as well. The psalms are everywhere in the liturgy — in the antiphons and acclamations of the Mass, and most particularly in the responsorial psalm that follows the first reading. The psalm that is sung at Mass usually echoes the themes of the first reading, and sometimes even comments on it. In their wonderful variety, the psalms teach us how to pray.





DECREE

Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass Extension – April 5, 2021 to April 25, 2021

While I have granted permission to begin the reopening of public Masses, due to the ongoing gravity of the present moment and the restrictions being placed on us during the civil reopening plan, I hereby extend the dispensation for **all Catholic faithful of the Diocese of Las Vegas and those Catholics visiting within the geographic boundaries of our Diocese, from the obligation of attending Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation up to and including Sunday, April 25, 2021.**

While we recognize that many are eager to return to Mass in our churches, it remains important for those who are elderly and otherwise at risk to refrain from returning to public Liturgies until it is manifestly safe to do so. For all the faithful, especially those who are sick, at high risk of becoming sick, and their caregivers, the obligation to attend Mass is hereby dispensed.





Bible Study on the Letter to the Hebrews Begins Week of April 19

The Letter to the Hebrews is more like a sermon than a letter. In it, the author tries to strengthen the faith of Christians who are slipping back into their old ways of life and turning away from their new life in Christ. Convinced in the truth and superiority of Christianity over other religions, he reviews the history of Israel to demonstrate how Jesus Christ fulfills and even surpasses all the hopes expressed in the Old Testament. Jesus is the unique High Priest who is simultaneously the one who offers sacrifice to God and is himself the sacrifice. Because Christ is both the high priest and perfect sacrifice, his saving action – his death, resurrection and exaltation – has made possible the forgiveness of sins, confident access to God and hope for eternal life with God. Join us for this 7-session study as we explore the eternal message found in the Letter to the Hebrews. **Classes begin the week of April 19 and will be offered on Mondays from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the church and repeated on Wednesdays from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. The Wednesday morning session will also be live-streamed** for those who prefer to participate from the comfort of their homes. Wearing a face mask at SEAS is required by all individuals age 2 and older. The mask is to be worn so it covers your mouth and your nose at all times. Although other states may be lifting their face mask mandates, those policies do not apply to us. Face masks are still mandated by both the State of Nevada and the Diocese of Las Vegas. At SEAS, you are expected to adhere to this safety guideline for the good of all present. There will be no exceptions.



Confessions

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered on **Mondays from 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. or until those confessions are finished.** Confessions are also heard by appointment. To make an appointment, call the church office at 702-228-8311 and press (0).

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: *“A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible.”*


