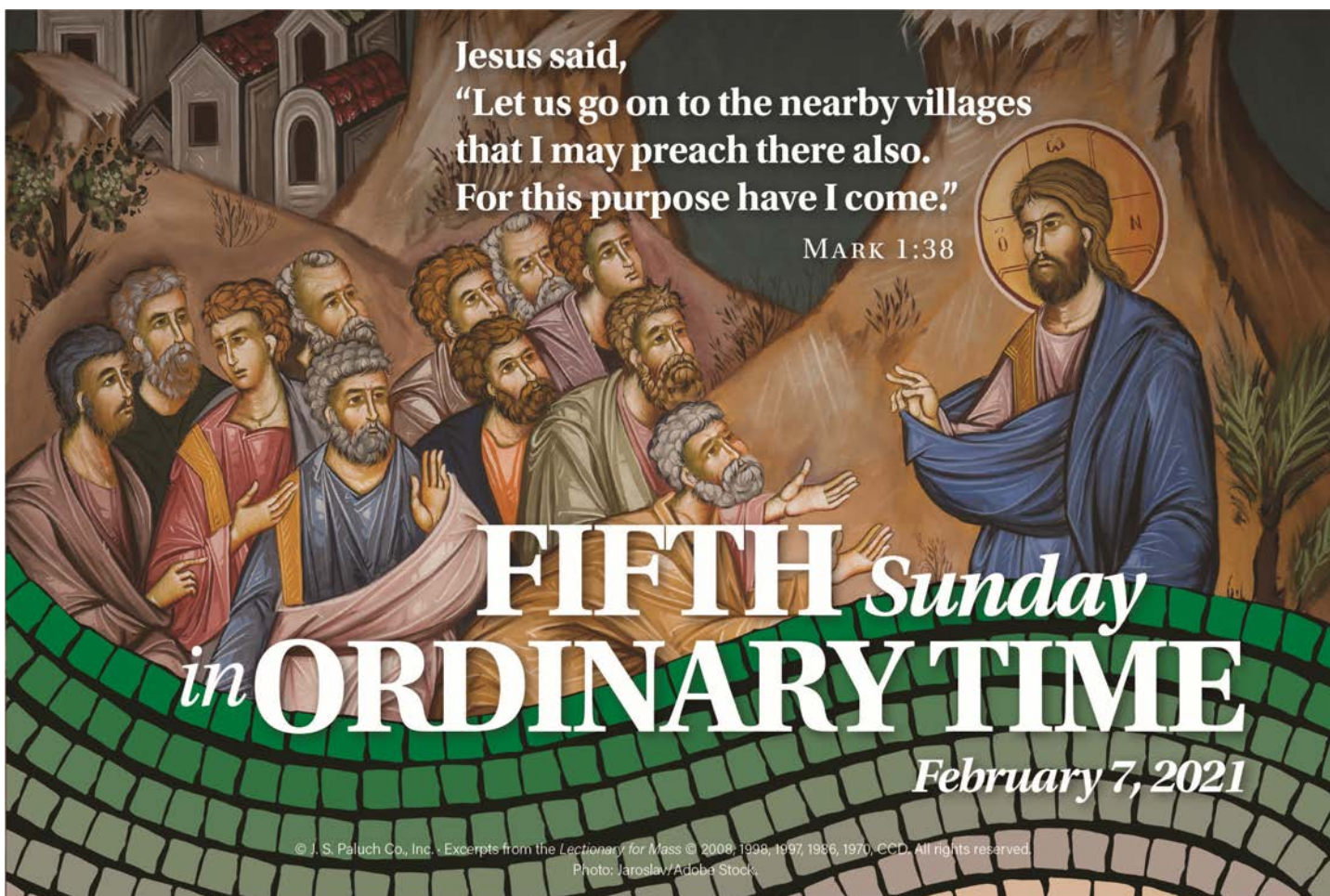

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

HEADS-UP! GET READY FOR A NEW LENT, COVID-STYLE!

In another ten days we'll begin our season of Lent with Ash Wednesday, February 17th. Due to the consequences of the coronavirus still in existence, our Lenten season will look a little different this year. Please remember, these adaptations and adjustments are made only because we care so much for all of you and ourselves. When the pandemic is behind us, we will hopefully be free of these extra precautions. Until then, our love and concern for ALL of you guides us in our Lenten observances. Here's a little preview of what to expect on Ash Wednesday:

Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday, February 17th, we will have our regular Sunday Mass schedule with the addition of a later evening Mass at 8PM. While Ash Wednesday is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation, and while there is NO OBLIGATION to receive ashes, it's one of the most well-attended Masses in the liturgical year!

All of our regular pandemic protocols will be in place and strictly observed as usual. This year, however, there will NOT be the traditional signing with ashes on the forehead. In order to limit any physical contact, the ashes will be simply sprinkled on top of the head of those who wish to come forward after the homily. No words will accompany this action, and for most people (especially those who have hair!) the ashes probably won't even be seen. But that's ok. After all, listen attentively to the gospel on Ash Wednesday (Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18) in which Jesus encourages us to do our penitential practices in secret...and God will reward what is done in secret.

It's going to be a different kind of Ash Wednesday AND a different kind of Lent. I'm actually looking forward to the "hidden" ways we will let this year's Lent be so special. More next weekend on our final preparations before Lent begins.

SEAS SCHOOL "DAY OF GIVING" SUCCESS!
At the time of this writing, there were a total of

84 responders to our Catholic School's Week "Day of Giving" for our own tremendous parish school, with donations totaling a little over \$11,000! That's \$3,000 over our goal of \$8,000! What's most encouraging is that we surpassed that goal even in the time of a world-wide pandemic that still has a hold on all of us. Feast of Faith

The Penitential Rite

Standing together in the presence of the Lord, we acknowledge our weakness, our sins and faults and failings. But the penitential rite is really less about our sins than it is about God’s mercy. It is not a time for individual confession, like a mini-sacrament of reconciliation. It is, rather, a preparatory rite, preparing us to praise the mercy of Christ as we acknowledge our own weakness. When Simon Peter witnesses the miraculous catch of fish—when he realizes who is in the boat with him—he falls at Jesus’ feet with the words, “Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man” (Luke 5:8). We are like Peter. The more aware of the Lord’s presence we become, the more awareness we also have of our sinfulness, our weakness.

The penitential rite of the Mass takes several forms, from the traditional *Confiteor* or “I confess” to a litany, spoken or sung by the deacon or cantor with responses by the entire assembly. The penitential rite always includes the words *Kyrie, eleison; Christe, eleison*—Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy. This ancient Greek prayer came to the Roman liturgy from the East, and still echoes in many of the litanies of the Eastern Rite Churches. These words turn our gaze from our own weakness to the gentleness, the kindness, the forgiving love of Christ.

The Good News

Today’s readings begin with a few verses from the book of Job. First, Job complains that his nights drag on endlessly. Then, worse yet, “My days are swifter than a weaver’s shuttle; / they come to an end without hope” (Job 7:6). Not exactly encouraging, these lamentations, not when taken alone.

Most of us have been there, though, and the antidote is the “good news” that Paul found so compelling that “an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it!” (1 Corinthians 9:16). Paul felt driven to announce the gospel to as many people as possible, “to save at least some” (9:22).

This good news is the mystery of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, who lifted Simon Peter’s mother-in-law from her sickbed with a mere touch of his hand. “The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons” (Mark 1:33–34)). Our woes and demons are as real as Job’s, and Jesus is our savior.

Saint of the Week

Saint Josephine Bakhita

1869 - 1947

Feast Day: Feb. 8

St. Josephine Bakhita was born in Sudan in 1869 and enslaved as a child. Eventually she was sold to an

Italian diplomat and taken to Italy, where she was later brought to freedom through the help of the Canossian Daughters of Charity. Through their guidance, she learned about God and served him faithfully until her death in 1947.

In October 2000, Josephine Bakhita was canonized by St. John Paul II, at which point he noted that "in St. Josephine Bakhita we find a shining advocate of genuine emancipation. The history of her life inspires not passive acceptance but the firm resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence, and to return them to their dignity in the full exercise of their rights" (St. Bakhita's Canonization Mass, October 1, 2000).

In the movie *St. Bakhita*, St. Josephine Bakhita is bought by an Italian white merchant named Federico Marin after years of being beaten and abused as an enslaved child. The cinematic depic-

tion of the saint's life shows that once in the Marin household, the daughter of the master, Aurora, takes a strong liking to Bakhita and chooses her as her nanny. Bakhita is treated like an outsider and accused of being wicked by other servants because of her black skin. Despite this, Bakhita proves to be generous to everyone she encounters even if they have wronged her.

Today, the feast day for St. Josephine Bakhita—February 8—is recognized as the annual day of prayer and awareness against human trafficking. Through prayer, we not only reflect on the experiences of those that have suffered through this affront to human dignity but also comfort, strengthen and help empower survivors.

As Bishop Eusebio Elizondo, former Chairman of the Committee on Migration, has stated: "On that day, we will lift our voices loudly in prayer, hope and love for trafficking victims and survivors. If just one person realizes from this day that they or someone they know is being trafficked, we will have made a difference."

February 8, 2021

Fact of Faith

Our Lady of Lourdes Feast Day: Feb. 11

In 1890, Pope Leo XIII allowed the local Diocese of Tarbes to celebrate this feast; Pope Pius X made it a universal feast in 1907. Lourdes is perhaps the most famous Marian shrine in Western Europe, where many go to invoke God's healing grace through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes. —CNS/USCCB

On February 11, the Church celebrates the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes. It was on this date in 1858 that an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a peasant girl named Bernadette Soubirous. Over the next month and a half, Mary—appearing as the Immaculate Conception—would appear a total of 18 times. After the ninth appearance, on February 25, Bernadette discovered a spring in the grotto where Mary appeared. Many miraculous cures have been ascribed to the waters of the spring.

Later in her life, Bernadette became a Sister of Charity of Nevers and sought a life of silence and prayer. She died on April 16, 1879, at the age of 35. She was canonized—declared a saint—in 1933.

St. Bernadette's accounts of seeing a heavenly vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary were initially met with skepticism. After a careful investigation by a commission established by the local bishop, the Church declared that her visions were genuine and contained nothing contrary to the Catholic faith. Given the powerful impact that such apparitions can have on individuals and the whole faith community, the Church always approaches such claims with great care and formally evaluates them before either accepting or rejecting a visionary's claims. Many times, the claims can't be substantiated or are contrary to the Church's faith. But Ber-

nadette's visions were quickly recognized as genuine. They encouraged a deeper life of prayer, especially praying the Rosary and encouraged a fervent trust in God's salvific power.

A Basic Stewardship Question:

Are You Searching for God?

A priest told this story once to illustrate how important it is to identify what you truly value and then pursue it.

He was a teenager, he said, and he and his cousin were playing basketball in his cousin's driveway. Suddenly, the cousin realized he had lost a contact lens. This was before the era of disposable contact lenses. Back in those days, you bought one pair of hard contact lenses and kept them until the next time you had an eye exam. They were costly, and people often found themselves on all fours searching for a missing contact.

So it was with the future priest and his cousin. They scoured the driveway and even looked in the surrounding grass. Alas, no contact lens was found, so they went inside to have a soda. In the house, they told the cousin's dad what had happened. He immediately went outside and started to search.

"It seemed that he was out there forever," said the priest. "He looked and looked and looked. And amazingly, he found that contact lens. Why did he find the missing lens and we didn't? Because my cousin and I were looking for a contact, but my uncle was looking for a hundred dollars."

To the priest, this humorous memory held a deeper truth: when we know the value of something, and desire it enough, we will be relentless in our search for it.

For Christian stewards, the search for God in our lives can never be a half-hearted, tepid response. It must be all or nothing. The search is a lifelong commitment. Thomas Merton offered a basic principle of stewardship: "A life is either all spiritual or not spiritual at all."

What is the stewardship question for me? Am I ready and willing to commit to the long search for God in my life?

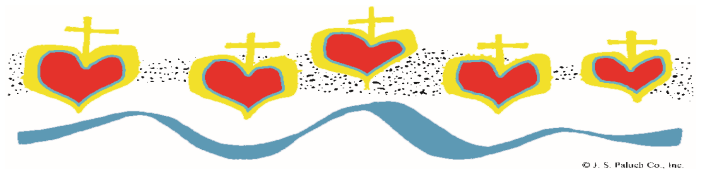

Lenten Rosary for Life

It's only in our relationship with God that we experience the conversion of heart that is necessary to truly love one another as God has loved us and build a culture that cherishes every human life. During this Lenten season, we invite you to join us as we pray and reflect on God's great gift of human life. Every day at 3:00 p.m. during Lent (including weekends) we will gather to pray a special Rosary for Life. This special rosary experience will be prayed Monday-Friday in the church and Saturday-Sunday in the Mater Dei Chapel. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Adoration and the Scriptural Way of the Cross Concluding with Benediction

Every Friday of Lent, from February 19 through March 26, come rest in silence with the Lord exposed on the altar from 6:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. At 7:00 p.m., we will begin the Scriptural Way of the Cross devotion with Taizé style refrains, and conclude the evening with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The Scriptural Way of the Cross is based on the stations written by St. John Paul II which incorporates Taizé music as well as other refrains sung in a Taizé style.

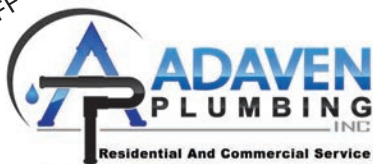
