

ABOUT THE END OF THE DISPENSATION TO ATTEND SUNDAY MASS

In response to many inquiries about the end of Bishop Thomas' dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass (effective after this weekend), our Judicial Vicar, the Very Rev. Robert M Herbst, OFM Conv., JCD, has prepared the following explanation for us all:

"Reflecting the Third Commandment, given to Moses by God, telling us to keep holy the Sabbath, the Catholic Church has considered Sunday to be the Sabbath day from time immemorial. It is presumed that the Apostles established this because Jesus rose from the dead on a Sunday. Similarly, the Church has always equated "keeping the Sabbath holy" with "Mass attendance," since it holds that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life (Canon 897, which is based on Lumen Gentium 11). In short, there is no better way for a Catholic to worship God than to devoutly attend Mass.

"Sunday Mass attendance is not optional; therefore, the recent General Dispensation given by Bishop Thomas was always meant to be temporary – not permanent. The notion of such a "permanent dispensation" from this important requirement of our faith is legally unthinkable, because it is theologically and spiritually unthinkable.

"Of course, there are many entirely legitimate reasons why a Catholic couldn't get to Mass on a Sunday, and this reality is addressed in canon 1248, §2, which states that if it is impossible to assist at the Eucharist, either because no priest is available or for some other grave reason, a Catholic should do something else that is liturgical/prayerful instead, as a substitute.

"In general, the "grave reason" means simply that...
For example, if someone is seriously infirm and is unable to get out of his or her house, this would constitute a grave reason to miss Mass. No Catholic is expected to risk his or her life in order to fulfill the Sunday obligation. These sorts of emergencies are normally temporary and so once they cease, the person simply resumes Sunday Mass attendance again. However, sometimes this "temporary" situation may be prolonged for more than just one or two Sundays – the most common scenario is perhaps that of the elderly or otherwise infirm person who is homebound. The Church never requires anyone by law to do something that is humanly impossible.

"In these cases, such as those who may still be homebound because of COVID-related issues, there is no need to request an "official" dispensation from the Bishop or Pastor – the Code of Canon Law already gives one the dispensation by the law itself. This application is made by the individual in good conscience – being able to say that it is not possible to attend Mass.

Jesus' Example of Helping Others

In today's second reading Paul offers a wonderful argument to his converts at Corinth for seeking to help those in need. He is dealing with a practical problem, arranging a collection for the poor of the church of Jerusalem; but as he often does, he develops an important teaching about Jesus to make his point.

After asking that they show their faith by generous gifts, he reminds them of the "gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). In the Incarnation our Lord assumed our human nature. certainly becoming poor for one who is God. The ultimate gracious act of this poverty was going to the cross with all its terrible sufferings. By this act of poverty we definitely become rich. Now our sins can be forgiven; we can share in the very life of God through the sacraments; we can attain eternal salvation!

"Let me interject with a personal example – I had a relative who on one Sunday who went grocery shopping, then went shopping in a large retail store, and then stopped for a light lunch – and then told me that she couldn't go to Mass that same day because she was afraid of "getting sick" from the people there. Was her excuse in 'good conscience'? Probably not – it was just an excuse for not attending Mass since she was able to be with many other people in similar confines. It was easily possible for her to attend Mass, there was no impossibility in her situation. We must be honest with ourselves and with God if we wish to apply this dispensation to ourselves.

"If one does feel that it is impossible to attend Mass, the Code of Canon Law asks the following: (Canon 1248, §2) ... "[those persons] devote themselves to prayer for a suitable time alone, as a family, or, as the occasion permits, in groups of families." As has been mentioned many times in the last year, the pious viewing or listening to a televised Mass while making a Spiritual Communion is a good option but can never replace the in-person celebration of the Eucharist if it is possible.

"In summation, while Bishop Thomas is not renewing the General Dispensation from the obligation for attending Sunday Mass at the end of June, Canon Law itself dispenses those for whom it is impossible to attend Mass, asking that they devote themselves to a suitable time in prayer instead of Mass attendance."

Therefore, as of June 28, the simple obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is back in place. As I preach many times, I hope we do not come to Mass because it is an obligation, but because of our sincere desire to thank God for the many blessings we receive every day. And what a blessing it is when we WANT to be together as a family of faith gathered in God's love. And what a privilege it is for each of us to be CALLED BY GOD to come to Mass and be nourished by God's own life in Word and Eucharist.

Saint of the Week

The First Martyrs of Rome

Dates: 64-68

Feast Day: June 30

After a raging fire destroyed two-thirds of Rome in 64, Emperor Nero blamed Rome's Christians to divert suspicion from himself. Those acknowledging their Christianity were arrested and executed. Some were covered in wax and set afire as torches; some were sewn into animal skins and cast into the arena with wild animals; others were crucified. Sts. Peter and Paul died in the same persecution. The feast of these earliest martyrs of the Roman church is celebrated a day after the joint feast of Peter and Paul. The Roman historian Tacitus said the protomartyrs were to be pitied "for it was felt that they were being sacrificed to one man's brutality."

Preparation of the Gifts

The altar is prepared, the gifts are received. Several brief rites follow with accompanying prayers, some prayed silently by the priest and deacon and others said aloud. We call this part of the Mass the "preparation." What kind of preparation is happening? First, the presider holds up the paten or bowl containing the hosts, and says words that Jesus must have said many times, since they derive from ancient Jewish meal prayers: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation!" We have brought forward our gifts, our offering to God, and now we acknowledge that they are not really ours—the gifts that we give are God's gift to us. It is "through your goodness" that we have gifts to offer. It is significant that we offer not wheat and grapes, but bread and wine; "fruit of the earth and work of human hands." Bread and wine are both God's work, and ours. These preparatory rites also prepare us for what we are about to do in the Eucharist, a mystery in which divine and human meet; a holy collaboration in which our action is caught up into God's divine plan.


