A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

OUR PRESENT SITUATION

We are living in uncertain times like no other. But, two things are certain: 1) God always loves and cares for us and never abandons us, even when God “seems” to be most distant, and 2) the most effective way we, as a parish community, can help limit the spread or contracting of this coronavirus is to not provide temptations for anyone to leave their homes. Therefore, Bishop Thomas has issued a Discontinuance Order for the entire Diocese of Las Vegas, much of which we were already doing here at SEAS. In it he states: “The time has arrived for us in the Diocese of Las Vegas to close all of our worship spaces entirely, thus discontinuing access to parish churches, adoration chapels, and other parish spaces where parishioners have gathered during these difficult days.” This means that we will not be able to hold any kind of personal meetings on the parish campus which includes, but not limited to: confessions, counseling, or any other in-person appointments. We are available to speak with you through the phone, but no confessions are allowed remotely. Most of us are working from home, if possible. Therefore, times for telephone conversations may be limited. Please call the parish office (702-228-8311) to make an appointment for a phone conversation.

Bishop Thomas also discourages any meetings in personal homes. He states: “I also encourage pastors to dissuade various groups, both related and unrelated to the parish (like charismatic, Marian, and fraternal organizations), from gathering in private homes, thus placing children and elderly in danger.” Again, this has already been the recent practice here at SEAS.

Regardless of what we know about anyone’s possible exposure or non-exposure to the virus, that should not change the vigilance each of us should always be practicing every minute of the day no matter where we are: keeping the social distance barriers, washing hands, not touching our eyes, nose or mouths, etc... In other words, we should be conducting our lives as if each one of us has the virus and assuming everyone else has the virus. For the fact is, we don’t know either.

OUR PRAYER CONTINUES

As an aid to our prayer during these rough times, we are working on a way to have a continuous live-streaming view of our parish sanctuary and

tabernacle via our parish website. In a digital way, everyone will be able to have virtual access to our worship space and a focal point for their prayer at any time during the day or night.

Presently, we continue to celebrate our entire daily and weekend Mass schedule without our regular congregation, but live-steamed through our parish website, www.seaslv.org. This is a great way in which we can all be united in prayer at the table of the Lord in a virtual way.

ONLINE GIVING INCREASES

While our buildings are closed for everyone’s safety, the parish life and operations never stop. Likewise, our bills don’t stop either. Many thanks to all of you who maintain your weekly contributions which help us tremendously. We’re doing the best we can, and hoping you’ll do what you can to help us financially survive.

There is GOOD NEWS to report: we’ve had over 97 new enrollments for online giving since March 13th! Thanks to all who were able to do that!

The stark reality remains, however, that so many in the Las Vegas valley have lost their jobs and just can’t afford to support their Church. My personal appeal goes to our parishioners who still have financial means to help: Will you continue to maintain your regular ongoing support? Will you consider an increase in your weekly giving to help recover our loss due to those who are now unemployed? Every little bit helps.

LET’S STAY CONNECTED

In this age of so much information and misinformation, it’s important that we stay connected as a parish family. The easiest way to stay connected is through our parish website www.seaslv.org and through our parish email system. There is more GOOD NEWS to report: we’ve had 67 new emails registered to our 3000+ previously registered emails. My appeal goes to those who have yet to register an email address with our parish, or those who have changed email address but didn’t let us know, or those who have previously inactivated their email address with us: through our parish website, please help us stay connected by making sure we have your current email address registered.



Catholic Social Teaching

Rights and Responsibilities

The principles that guide Catholic Social Teaching are derived from both Scripture and Tradition. Centuries of reflection on both God's revelation and the human condition have led the Church to delineate a set of underlying principles that reflect our moral theology, and the Christian anthropology that shape our teaching and preaching.

One important aspect of Catholic Social Teaching is the balancing of rights and responsibilities. The Church believes that every human being has certain rights as a child of God. The Second Vatican Council's document, "Gaudium et Spes," or The Church in the Modern World, says:

There is a growing awareness of the sublime dignity of human persons, who stand above all things and whose rights and duties are universal and inviolable. They ought, therefore, to have ready access to all that is necessary for living a genuinely human life: for example, food, clothing, housing, the right freely to choose their state of life and set up a family, the right to education, work, to their good name, to respect, to proper knowledge, the right to act according to the dictates of conscience and to safeguard their privacy, and rightful freedom, including freedom of religion.

But these rights are balanced by responsibilities. Every human being has the duty to one another, to our families, and to our society. These responsibilities include moral rectitude and a willingness to make sacrifices for the common good of all. Without these responsibilities, human rights can too easily become a personal competition for scarce resources.

The Gospel of John

The Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke are called the synoptic Gospels, coming from the two Greek words "optic," meaning "to see," and "syn," meaning "together" or "similarly." They are called so because the three describe basically the same events in Jesus' life; they are called so also to distinguish them from the other Gospel: the Gospel of John.

The Gospel of John was probably the last of the four Gospels to be written, and experts usually place its composition in the late first century. It is commonly held that the prologue (1:1-18) and the appendix (21:1-25) were added to the original Gospel. This is particularly obvious about the appendix, for there is a clear conclusion to the Gospel of John at the end of chapter 20.

The portrait of Jesus in this Gospel is unique for its supreme theology: Jesus is the Word of God, existing with God from the beginning of time (1:1-2). He is all-knowing and all-powerful; even the guards and soldiers who come to arrest Jesus fall down and worship him before they take him away (18:6). Most of the stories in John are not found in the other Gospels; among the unique stories are the wedding feast at Cana, the Samaritan woman at the well, the raising of Lazarus and Jesus' washing of the feet of the disciples. Jesus has a lot to say in John; there are long discourses with familiar phrases such as, "I am the good shepherd," "I am the resurrection," and "I am the true vine": weighty statements of a lofty theology.

While the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke each have one year of the three-year lectionary cycle assigned for their proclamation, the Gospel of John does not. Rather, John is proclaimed on Sundays during the forty days of Lent and during the fifty days of the Easter season, as well as during the celebrations of particular feasts—such as Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Pentecost and Christmas Day.

In art, the evangelist John is usually the only one of the four to be beardless, and there is an eagle by his side or near his head. Though they were probably two different people historically, tradition has merged the figures of the apostle John and the evangelist John. The feast of Saint John is December 27.



Saint of the Week

**Saint Isidore of Seville,
Bishop and Doctor of the Church**
Dates: 560 - April 4, 636
Feast Day - April 4

This bishop's extensive writings influenced church thinking for a millennium. As bishop of Seville, Spain, from about 600 until his death, he presided over two councils, promoted acceptance of the "filioque" clause of the Creed, and battled the Arian heresy. He wrote a history of the barbarian invasions of Spain and compiled in "The Etymologiae" all that was known in his time. Nearing death, he gave away everything he had, confessed his faults to his people in church and received Communion. Pope John XXIII admired his ideas about the ideal bishop, notably that "Every bishop should be distinguished as much by his humility as by his authority." A Doctor of the Church, Isidore is the patron saint of computer users.

Embracing the Cross of Jesus

The Lenten season offers us a unique opportunity to focus more intently on the gift of the cross. Do you ever think about how you experience the cross of Jesus Christ? Do you ever think about the power of that cross in your daily life? Is the cross even relevant to your life? It is to

stewards of the Lord, who recognize the hope Christ brings through the gift of his cross. They acknowledge that for them, the cross is their only hope. Being good stewards of our life in Christ is not easy, but to embrace the cross is not only countercultural, it seems absurd. Then again, we cannot avoid what Jesus said to his disciples:

If you wish to come after me you must deny yourself and take up your cross daily and follow me. For if you wish to save your life, you will lose it; but if you lose your life for my sake you will save it (Luke 9:23-24).

The cross is more readily embraced by people of faith who suffer, are poor, broken or are the victims of such things as violence, oppression or natural disaster. They see the cross as the hope that no matter what has happened to them, God will see them through. The Father did it for Jesus who hung on the cross, so surely their sufferings will be redeemed by Jesus' sufferings.

Where people possess much material abundance, comfort and leisure, however, there is a tendency to de-emphasize the cross, to draw away from it. They can't touch it or feel it so they wish to "save" their lives by looking to other things: power, wealth, fame, relevance, being the center of attention. What is preached about the cross from the pulpit sounds good, but in reality something more

tangible is desired.

Christ emptied himself completely in humble obedience, allowing himself to suffer and die out of compassion for the world (Philippians 2:6-11). Good stewards follow his example and work day-to-day to empty themselves and live compassionately; most noticeably by sharing their lives with others.

As we approach the climax of our liturgical year, the Easter triduum, let us ask the Holy Spirit for an even deeper awareness of the cross in our lives. Let us find hope in the cross and pray that as we embrace it, we too will experience in a special way the joy of new life in the risen Lord.

A Stewardship Moment

Jesus called to his friend from the dead, "Lazarus, come out!" It is the same call our Lord makes to us unceasingly: "Come out!" Jesus calls us from our tomb of doubt and unbelief, from the darkness of our fear and anxieties; from the depths of our weaknesses and lack of hope. Christian stewards pray for an open heart so that they may hear the voice of the Lord, heed the continuous call to come away from their former way of living and reprioritize their lives in the light of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Do we believe Christ has the power to transform our lives? Do we take time to listen for his call?






