

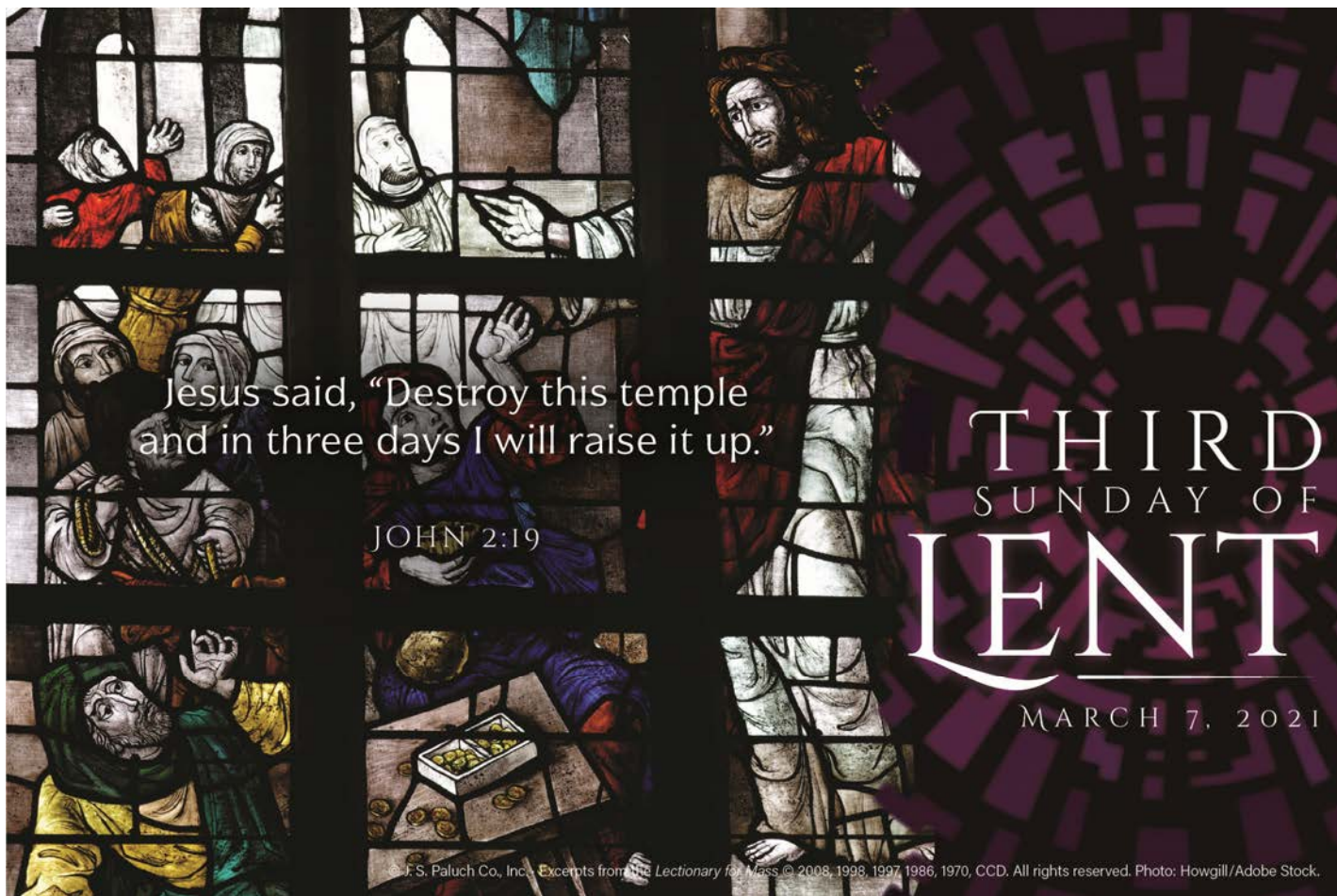

It's my hope, in these words of reflection, words of information, words of gratitude, words of encouragement, and sometimes words of challenge, that God's abundant **mercy** may always flow as God's unconditional and redemptive **love** is always offered to us.

I can't promise that there will be a letter each week, but here's to the hopeful next 75!

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH: A SPECIAL NOVENA

Back on December 8th, 2020, Pope Francis declared a Year of St. Joseph coinciding with the 150th Anniversary of Blessed Pius IX declaring St. Joseph the Patron of the Catholic Church. You can go to the diocesan website, www.dolv.org, for more detailed information and direct links to the letter from Pope Francis along with the Decree of this special year.

This coming March 19th is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Husband of Mary. To help us celebrate this special feast of the Church and commemorate this graced Year of St. Joseph, we will pray a special **Novena to St. Joseph from March 10 through March 18**. This Novena will be prayed at the conclusion of the **40 Days of Prayer for Life Rosary** prayed daily through March 28 here at SEAS at 3PM.

In Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter, *Patris Corde* (With a Father's Heart) he states the ways his predecessors have referred to St. Joseph: In addition to Blessed Pius IX's declaration of St. Joseph as

"Patron of the Catholic Church," Venerable Pius XII proposed him as the "Patron of Workers" and St. John Paul II called him the "Guardian of the Redeemer." Universally St. Joseph has been invoked as the "Patron of a happy death."

Let us pray through the intercession of St. Joseph in the prayer given to us by Pope Francis:

*Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.*

CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP APPEAL (CSA) PROGRESS!

In the Diocese of Las Vegas, SEAS is considered the largest parish as far as the CSA goes. Of all the parishes in the Diocese, SEAS has had the highest CSA goal for quite some time, this year being \$323,685. So far, as of February 28, we have the highest amount pledged (\$183,383.15) and the highest amount of fulfilled pledges and cash already received by the Diocese (\$129,234.65). For a little over a month into the 2021 CSA, I'd say we're off to a good start!

Of course, our own parish goal is to have **100% participation from all of our registered households!** Remember in my letter to all of you that the Diocese of Las Vegas is like our "Mom," and our "Mom" needs our help. At this time we have 356 households participating out of 5,000 which is about 7.1% of our membership. Can I ask the remaining 92.9% of our parish to help out as well? Remember, no gift is too small and no gift is too large, for EVERY GIFT IS PRECIOUS AND GREATLY APPRECIATED!

Total Allegiance

In previous weeks we have seen how the theme of covenant—as a preparation for the baptismal covenant celebrated at Easter—occupies an important place in our cycle of Lenten readings. The notion of covenant as a relationship between two parties carries with it an expectation of mutual accountability and fidelity to the terms of the covenant. When God forged the covenant with the Jewish people on Mt. Sinai, it was a pledge of God's protection, and it would forever permit them familiar access as the Chosen People. For their part, the Jewish people were to observe the dictates of the law, summarized most succinctly here in the form of the Ten Commandments. To be in a covenantal relationship with the Lord God requires an exclusive relationship, just as discipleship with Jesus—ritualized in baptism—demands a total allegiance to him and none other.

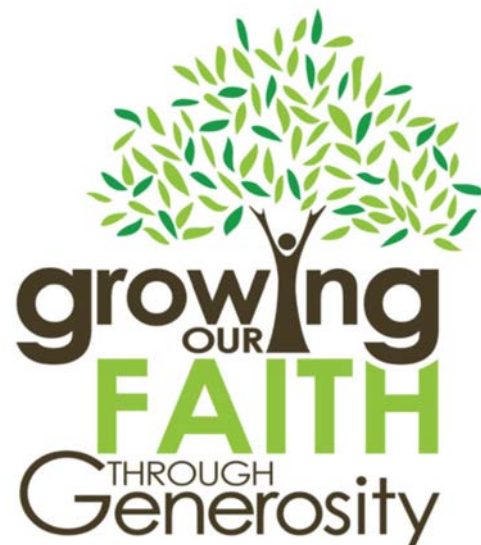
Mercy flows... Love redeems cont.

Here's what would happen if we had 100% participation at only \$250 per household for the year: Our total contribution to the 2021 CSA would equal \$1.25 million! Subtracting our parish goal of \$323,685, means we would receive back in rebate \$926,315! Can you imagine?! Remember, whatever we receive back in rebate will go toward the enhancements to our parish worship space which was targeted for completion in our parish Jubilee Year of 2020. That's been the designated beneficiary of our CSA rebates for the past few years, and will remain the designated beneficiary until we can complete that project.

I have to confess, I still have yet to make my own pledge to the CSA. Once I get my personal taxes completed, I'll make mine. As I mentioned in my letter, I have to lead by example, so I'm going to personally pledge \$1,000 to this year's CSA. Will ALL of you please join me in whatever amount is possible? If you've misplaced your pledge card, you can use the one in the bulletin and mail it directly to the Diocese of Las Vegas.

Catechetical Corner

Jesus Forgave Sins

The Gospels provide numerous examples of Christ's mission to forgive sins. When a paralytic was lowered through the roof of a house and placed at his feet, Christ first forgave the man's sins and then cured his affliction (cf. Lk 5:17-26). When a sinful woman knelt at his feet in the house of Simon the Pharisee, Jesus forgave her sins because she had "loved much," unlike the Pharisee, who had little insight into his own sinfulness (cf. Lk 7:36-50). Christ's parable of the prodigal son illustrates the sublime meaning of his earthly ministry, which is to forgive sins, reconcile people to God, and lead us to true happiness (cf. Lk 15:11-32).

Jesus died on the Cross and rose from the dead to reconcile sinful people with God through the forgiveness of sins and the gift of new life with the Triune God. Even on the Cross, he forgave those who were killing him and had mercy on the repentant thief.

Only God can forgive our sins. But Jesus willed that the Church should be his instrument of forgiveness on earth. On Easter night the Risen Christ imparted to his Apostles his own power to forgive sins. He breathed on them, imparting the promised Holy Spirit, and said, "Peace be with you." Jesus was actually filling them with peace that is rooted in friendship with God. But he did more. He shared with them his own merciful mission. He breathed on them a second time and said,

As the Father has sent me, so I send you. . . . Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained. (Jn 20:21-23)

That night Jesus gave the Church the ministry of the forgiveness of sins through the Apostles (cf. CCC, no. 1461). By the Sacrament of Holy Orders, bishops and priests continue this ministry to forgive sins, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In this Sacrament, the priest acts in the person of Christ, the Head of the Church, to reconcile the sinner to both God and

the Church. "When he celebrates the Sacrament of Penance, the priest is fulfilling the ministry of the Good Shepherd who seeks the lost sheep. . . . The priest is the sign and instrument of God's merciful love for the sinner" (CCC, no. 1465).

The Sacrament of Penance involves a conversion of our hearts to God, a confession of sins to a priest, the forgiveness of our sins, a penance to make some amends for sin, and reconciliation with God and the Church. For those who commit mortal sin after Baptism, this Sacrament is necessary for being reconciled to God and the Church.

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: "A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."

Postures of the Mass

In the Mass, we pray not only with our lips, but with our bodies as well. We stand when the ministers enter. In Western culture, standing is a sign of attention, a mark of respect: all stand when the judge enters the courtroom, for example. Standing is also an ancient posture of prayer, mentioned frequently in the Old Testament. When the readings begin, we sit down: a listening posture. Mary sat at Jesus' feet to listen to his teaching; the crowds sat on the hillside or the seashore to hear his words. Kneeling is another posture that is full of meaning. It expresses adoration and worship, but it can also express humility and contrition. We bow: a sign of honor and reverence, acknowledging the presence of God, especially when we receive the Eucharist. And there are other ritual gestures as well—striking the breast, genuflecting and of course making the sign of the cross. The liturgy invites us to pray with our whole person—with heart and mind, voice and body.

Saint of the Week

Saint Luigi Orione

Dates: 1872 - 1940

Feast Day: March 12

The founder of The Little Work of Divine Providence, which encompasses two active and two contemplative religious orders for men and women as well as a lay movement, was born in Italy's Piedmont. After early sojourns with Franciscans and Salesians, he entered the seminary of the Diocese of Tortona and was ordained in 1895. Always devoted to the care of others, especially the poor and sick, Don Orione established schools and learning centers, worker hostels, hospitals and homes for the elderly, disabled, sick and blind. The members of his apostolate serve today in 300 foundations in Europe, Asia, Africa and North and South America. The dying words of this priest, who was canonized in 2004, were "Jesus...Jesus...Jesus."

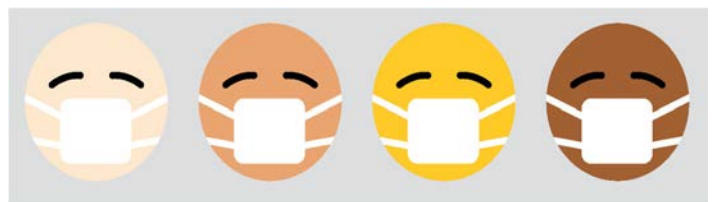


Novena to St. Joseph March 10 - 18

Embracing the Cross of Jesus Christ

The Lenten season offers us a unique opportunity to focus more intently on the gift of the cross. Do you ever think about how you experience the cross of Jesus Christ? Do you ever think about the power of that cross in your daily life? Is the cross even relevant to your life? It is to stewards of the Lord, who

recognize the hope Christ brings through the gift of his cross. They acknowledge that for them, the cross is their only hope. Being good stewards of our life in Christ is not easy, but to embrace the cross is not only countercultural, it seems absurd. Then again, we cannot avoid what Jesus said to his disciples:

If you wish to come after me you must deny yourself and take up your cross daily and follow me. For if you wish to save your life, you will lose it; but if you lose your life for my sake you will save it (Luke 9:23-24).

The cross is more readily embraced by people of faith who suffer, are poor, broken, or are the victims of such things as violence, oppression or natural disaster. They see the cross as the hope that no matter what has happened to them, God will see them through. The Father did it for Jesus who hung on the cross, so surely their sufferings will be redeemed by Jesus' sufferings.

Where people possess much material abundance, comfort and leisure, however, there is a tendency to de-emphasize the cross, to draw away from it. They can't touch it or feel it so they wish to "save" their lives by looking to other things: power, wealth, fame, relevance, being the center of attention. What is preached about the cross from the pulpit sounds good, but in reality something more tangible is desired.

Christ emptied himself completely in humble obedience, allowing himself to suffer and die out of compassion for the world (Philippians 2:6-11). Good stewards follow his example and work day-to-day to empty themselves and live compassionately; most noticeably by sharing their lives with others.

As we approach the climax of our liturgical year, the Easter triduum, let us ask the Holy Spirit for an even deeper awareness of the cross in our lives. Let us find hope in the cross and pray that as we embrace it, we too will experience in a special way the joy of new life in the risen Lord.

If your parish celebrates the Mass for the First Scrutiny for catechumens preparing for Baptism at the Easter vigil, you may hear the Gospel story of Jesus speaking with the Samaritan woman at the well; someone who supposedly is of the wrong gender, wrong religion and has lived the wrong life. The woman is overwhelmed by guilt and shame. And yet Jesus speaks to her and offers her "living waters" to quench her spiritual thirst. The living water that Jesus gives is new life through the Holy Spirit; a life that is accepted, forgiven, loved and eternal. Good stewards of their life in Christ remain mindful of their own spiritual thirst. They listen to Jesus who speaks to them just as he spoke with the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus has living water for us today. He encourages us to come and drink. Are you thirsty? Are you ready to listen to him?

When the celebration of Easter comes and we, united in hope, once again reaffirm our faith in Jesus, let us stand with the true conviction that through Christ all things are possible. We *will* rise.

Lenten Observances

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been extended through Easter Sunday, of the Resurrection of the Lord, April 4, 2021.

Fasting

In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (February 17) and Good Friday (April 2). To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller

quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

Abstinence from Meat

Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

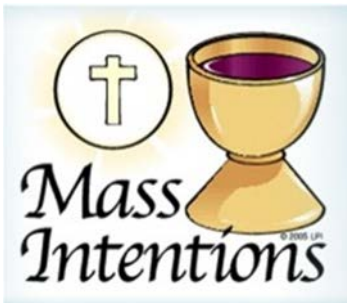

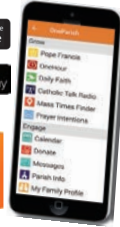
