

Mercy flows... Love redeems

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

AWAY, BUT STILL PRESENT

I write this brief missive on Tuesday, May 11, from Mesquite, Nevada. Through the generosity of one of our parishioners, I have the privilege of spending these few days in a quiet resort time-share. Nonetheless, I'm still present to the parish life that continues while I'm temporarily away.

I can draw a very light similarity of my situation to the time when Jesus ascended to the Father, yet never really left his disciples. He promised he would return and soon he would send a "helper" or "advocate." By the time you read this, I will have returned, and while I was away, I had many "helpers" who would make sure things were running smoothly. I am so blessed with Fr. Gene and our dedicated staff who keep things going while I'm away.

LOOKING AHEAD...

While away, I still had to take care of some things as we continue to prepare to "open-up" some of our ministries. On the docket are preparations for welcoming back and re-establishing our Altar Servers while also recruiting new Altar Servers as well. Altar Servers can be anywhere from 4th grade on up without any limitations due to age or gender. Perhaps we might have some groups of three consisting of a mix of parent(s) and child(ren). The possibilities are endless. Keep an eye on the bulletin for more details as we move forward.


Likewise, preparations are underway to get our Mater Dei Adoration Chapel back in operation. This will require a sacred commitment on the part of at least 118 adorers to cover the nearly 59 hours of adoration each week. We will need **at least two adorers per hour** of adoration each week, in addition to some extras to allow for subs. We will also need at least another 24 individuals to take on the responsibilities of exposing and reposing the Blessed Sacrament at the "bookends" of our adoration times (that would be at least 2 people at the beginning and 2 at the conclusion of the six days of adoration from Monday through Saturday).

But, before we can reinstate our adoration program, we need to secure our Mater Dei Adoration Chapel with surveillance cameras in addition to installing a video system to allow the livestreaming of our chapel during times of adoration. We're in the process of getting the bids to make all of this happen with the hope that some donors might come forward with the necessary funds to make this a reality sooner rather than later. Our present budget and still not-yet-recovered weekly collections cannot handle this added expense. Watch the bulletin for further details. God will provide!





The General Intercessions

The general intercessions were restored to the liturgy in the reforms that followed the Second Vatican Council. In these prayers—also known as the "universal prayer" or "prayer of the faithful" the assembly prays for the Church, the world, and the local community. As the name "prayer of the faithful" reminds us, these intercessions are a privilege of the baptized, which is why any catechumens are dismissed before the Creed and the intercessions. In baptism, we become members of a royal priesthood, and what do priests do? They intercede; they pray. In standing to pray to God as a community, we are living out our royal priesthood.

The intercessions at Mass usually follow a clear pattern, moving from general to specific needs. We pray for the whole Church. We pray for the world and for our nation. We pray for our local community, for those who have died and for all the sick and afflicted. In our united prayer, we reach beyond ourselves and our own needs and grow in awareness of and compassion for the needs of others.

The Significance of the Ascension


The theological unity, or perhaps even the temporal experience of the early community, made it seem that Jesus' resurrection and his ascension were inseparable aspects of a single mystery. Only in the later writings of Luke and John has further theological reflection helped the Christian community to distinguish different dimensions of the mystery. Liturgical tradition has followed the forty-day chronology formulated by Luke. We would miss the point, however, if we were to demand a precise historical chronology of events such as the Resurrection-Ascension that are primarily spiritual in nature and that clearly surpass the bounds of time and space as we know them.

What is important for us to grasp is the significance of the Ascension. For Luke, it is the decisive turning point that marks the end of Jesus' earthly ministry and the beginning of the disciples' Spirit-led ministry and thus the ministry of the whole church down to our own day.

The Ascension

On the Feast of the Ascension, the church celebrates the return of Christ to the Father, his physical body leaving the earth behind. In John's Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that his return to the Father is necessary so that the Holy Spirit can be given to his disciples.

For many years, this feast was celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation on the Thursday after the Sixth Sunday of Easter. The precise date moved from year to year, as the date of Easter moved based on the lunar calendar. Not long ago, most of the diocese in the United States moved the celebration of the Ascension to the Seventh Sunday of Easter. The ecclesiastical provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Philadelphia, and the State of Nebraska have maintained the celebration on the Thursday after the sixth Sunday of Easter.

So, why couldn't the risen Christ have simply stayed with us, guiding the Church on Earth for all time? Imagine what the world would look like today if Christ has not ascended. If Christ were still walking the earth, what would faith be? Where would our free will be? My own opinion is that it was necessary for Christ to ascend and send the Holy Spirit so that our faith would matter, and our free will remain intact. God is still with us, and present to us, but in ways that allow us to freely choose to accept or reject his grace. Christ is present in the Eucharist, in the Word of God proclaimed, and in his Body the Church. The Holy Spirit is present to us, dwelling within us, received at our Baptism and sealed at our Confirmation. But these ways of remaining with us are not so concrete that our free will is collapsed. He has the ability to choose the Good, and to choose to accept God's grace, and he's never going to do anything that makes that choice less meaningful.

So, the feast of the Ascension is important to us, not because it's a big "good-bye" to Jesus, but because it ushers in a new era in which Christ continues to be present to us, and in which the Holy Spirit dwells in the hearts of all believers.






Holiday Hours
