

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

To all those who are mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, step-mothers, foster-mothers, or anyone who has "mothered" anyone in their lifetime, I'd like to wish a Happy Mother's Day! While this is not a liturgical feast, it's part of our American culture and certainly can't be ignored. Therefore, for all of you who fall into any of the above categories, THANK YOU SO MUCH for being an image of God's tender love, care and compassion in a world so desperately in need of it. May God continue to bless you for your goodness!

For myself, Mother's Day is always a bittersweet day. Why? For me, anyone in those above categories is already at home with the Lord. My mom (+Josephine Jankowski) died in 1977 when I was 16 years old, my maternal grandmother (+Anna Dulny) died in 1966, my paternal grandmother (+Veronica Jankowski) in 1986 (just 9 days before my dad), my godmother (+Rose Krochmal) in 2005 and my stepmother (+Geraldine "Bum" Jankowski) died 7 years ago in 2014.

This Mother's Day is "bitter" in that there are no more surviving "motherly" relatives left in my family; it's "sweet" in that I'm sure I can count on their intercession from their eternal dwelling place with God. I know that God, in God's ever-generous love and mercy, has welcomed them home to that magnificent place of love we all hope to attain!

And so, I believe I join with many of you for whom this Mother's Day is "bittersweet." May we never forget, especially during this month of May, that ALL OF US are privileged to have the greatest intercessor in heaven in the person of the Blessed Virgin Mary. May she, the model for all mothers, continue to lead us closer to her son so that each of us may strive to be better disciples.

As Pope Francis has asked us to pray the rosary during the month of May for an end to our pandemic, he also gave us a beautiful prayer to pray for Our Lady's intercession during these still-trying times throughout the world. Please consider adding the following to your daily prayer time:

"We fly to your protection, O Holy Mother of God".

Feast of Faith

The Creed

Following the readings and the homily, we stand together and say or sing the Creed, our profession of faith. The Creed is a solemn statement of belief, a "rule of faith" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 67). It states the core of what we believe about God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The language of the Creed is knotty and difficult at times, precisely because its purpose is to express with precision what we believe about God. The Creed that we pray most often, the Nicene Creed, came out of the earliest ecumenical councils: Nicea in 325 and Constantinople in 381. It originated in a time of great controversy about the divinity of Christ, and thus the longest section of the Creed relates to Christ, truly human and truly God.

The Creed is both communal and personal: it is "we," but it is also "I." In the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, it is only after listening to the teaching of the Church and professing faith in the Holy Trinity that the candidate is admitted to the sacraments. So it is every Sunday. We listen to the word, we profess our faith and then we come to the altar.



The Presence of the Holy Spirit

We have a unique episode in the Acts of the Apostles today. A whole roomful of people are baptized with the Holy Spirit before they are baptized with water! The verb used --- "the Holy Spirit 'fell' on them" (Acts 10:44) — is characteristic of the way the Spirit works throughout the book of Acts: powerful and surprising. Though this "baptism" is not the normative way the New Testament describes baptism, it is still a good reminder today that the Holy Spirit is not controlled by whether or not we pour water, but rather that our sacramental signs reveal the presence of the Spirit at work among us. And we have a double reinforcement of how this work is accomplished from a Letter and a Gospel bearing John's name. It is love, self-sacrificing and self-giving love, that manifests the Spirit of Jesus in our midst. It is love that is the greatest of commandments. The Spirit is manifested equally through those who live in that love.

Fact of Faith

A Marian Glossary

"She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us."—Pope Francis, Gaudete et Exsultate, no. 176

Below is a brief outline of important terms about or related to the Blessed Mother.

ANNUNCIATION: The visit of the angel Gabriel to the virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the mother of the Savior. After giving her consent to God's word, Mary became the mother of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit.

ASSUMPTION: The dogma which recognizes the Blessed Virgin Mary's singular participation in her Son's Resurrection by which she was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, when the course of her earthly life was finished.

HAIL MARY: The prayer known in Latin as the Ave Maria. The first part of the prayer praises God for the gifts he gave to Mary as Mother of the Redeemer; the second part seeks her maternal intercession for the members of the Body of Christ, the Church, of which she is the Mother.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION: The dogma proclaimed in Christian Tradition and defined in 1854, that from the first moment of her conception, Mary — by the singular grace of God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ — was preserved immune from original sin.

MAGNIFICAT: The title commonly given to the Latin text and vernacular translation of the Canticle (or Song) of Mary that she recites at the time of the visitation. The canticle begins with "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord."

MARY: The mother of Jesus. Because she is the mother of Jesus — Son of God and second Person of the Blessed Trinity — according to the flesh, she is rightly called the Mother of God (Theotokos). Mary is also called "full of grace," and "Mother of the Church," and in Christian prayer and devotion, "Our Lady," the "Blessed Virgin Mary," and the "New Eve."

PRESENTATION: The presentation and dedication of Jesus to God by Mary and Joseph in the Temple (Lk 2:22-39), in accord with Mosaic Law concerning the first-born. At the Presentation, Simeon and Anna sum up the expectation of Israel for the long-awaited Messiah, the light of the nations and the glory of Israel, but also as a sign of contradiction. The presentation of the gifts, especially of bread and wine, is a preparatory rite for the liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass.

ROSARY: A prayer in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which repeats the privileged Marian prayer Ave Maria, or Hail Mary, in "decades" of ten prayers, each preceded by the Pater Noster ("Our Father") and concluded by the Gloria Patri (Glory Be to the Father), accompanied by meditation on the mysteries of Christ's life. The rosary was developed by medieval piety in the Latin church as a popular substitute for the liturgical Prayer of the Hours.

VIRGIN BIRTH: The conception of Jesus in the womb of the Virgin Mary solely by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Church's confession of faith in the virgin birth affirms that Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit without human seed.

VIRGIN MARY: The mother of Jesus, who is honored as "ever-virgin" for her perpetual virginity.

VISITATION: At the annunciation, the angel Gabriel told Mary that she would be the mother of the savior. Gabriel also told Mary that her barren cousin, Elizabeth, had conceived a son in her old age. Mary went to visit her cousin and confirmed the truth of the angel's words. The time she spent with Elizabeth is referred to as "the visitation."



Saint of the Week

Our Lady of Fatima Dates: 20th Century Feast Day: May 13

Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She entrusted the children with three secrets regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a "bishop in white" shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him. At the Vatican last October 13, Pope Francis stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary.

The Sixth Sunday of Easter

In today's Gospel, Jesus commands his disciples, whom he calls ","friends," to love one another as he loves them. Jesus uses the word "love" as a verb or a noun nine times. He also employs the word "command" or "commandment" five times. His command to love one another is explicit. Those who understand the depth of Christ's love for us have reason to be joyful. We are called to be stewards of this loving friendship; to love one another as Jesus loves us. Do we give serious attention to what this love requires of us? What is the price of this friendship with the Lord? Are we willing to pay this price to keep Christ's riendship?

To Love as Jesus Loves: An Easter Reflection

Excerpted from the 2021 book, The Heart of the Mission: Simple Ways to Bring People to Jesus by Cande de Leon, executive director for the Office of Mission Advancement, Diocese of Phoenix, published by Our Sunday Visitor.

Jesus has given each baptized Catholic a mission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19 -20). Our mission is to live this calling every day of our lives.

People are at the heart of the mission of the Church. Strengthening relationships, boldly growing engagement and connecting people to the mission are simple ways to bring people to Jesus. It is not complicated — we just need to bring people to Jesus. God is always drawing closer to us, so we can rest assured that he is the one doing the hard work — not us! In order to bring people to Jesus, we must start with loving and caring for people one at a time. It has to come from a genuine desire to love and show people that they matter. After all, why would anyone listen to the Good News from us, if we haven't shown them God's love?

If we are all God's children, then we have a responsibility to help each other. We are meant to live in relationship, and to be the living presence of God in the world — to show his love to the people around us. This means treating people like family, not transactions. It's easy to do this with the people we enjoy being around. It's a lot harder to put into practice when we are talking about a coworker or acquaintance who drives us crazy. But like it or not, we are all called to this. For me this is a revolutionary idea: I am not better than anyone else. The world tries to separate us all the time by putting us into categories of race, gender or socioeconomic status. Those don't really matter.

We are all children of God. It is important for all of us to try to see the people in front of us and love them like Jesus does. I invite you to join me in that, to strive each day to see people as your brothers and sisters and to treat them accordingly.

New Safety Protocols at SEAS

As of May 1, reservations to attend Mass at SEAS are no longer necessary. Although safety protocols are starting to relax, the obligation to attend Mass in the Diocese of Las Vegas is still lifted through Sunday, May 30. While the obligation to attend Mass is lifted, we will continue to live-stream all of our Masses and services through our website, www.seaslv.org.

In addition, please note our newest safety guidelines effective May 1st:

- Social distancing has been reduced to 3 feet.
- Seating will be first come, first seated, and households should distance themselves 3 feet apart in the pews. Once the church is filled, guests will be seated in the parish hall where they can view the live-streamed Mass from the church and receive Holy Communion. Due to social distancing, seating may limited and is not guaranteed.
- Face masks are still required to be worn by all individuals age 2 and older.
- Hands must be sanitized upon entering the church.
- Everyone will still be required to follow the guidance of the Hospitality Ministers at the end of Mass as they assist guests with the proper way to exit the church.
- Contributions to the weekly offertory and other collections will accepted in the collection baskets in the gathering space.
- During Mass, a verbal sign of peace may be offered without physical contact.
- For everyone's safety, we continue to ask that the Eucharist be received reverently in the hand.

Be aware, however, that our parish life goes on, and there may be times you might see someone cleaning, or setting up for a service, or whatever. This live-streamed view is just another opportunity to be virtually close to the Eucharistic Presence of Christ in the tabernacle no matter where you are.



Confessions

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered on **Mondays from 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. or until those confessions are finished.** Confessions are also heard by appointment. To make an appointment, call the

church office at 702-228-8311 and press (0).

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: "A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."
