#### Inspiration for the week

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The same holds for God. Either we serve God, or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood. ## MERCY FLOWS, LOVE REDEEMS, CONT.

#### **RELIGIOUS EXEMPTION REQUESTS**

I was recently caught off-guard by a request to grant a religious exemption for the purpose of not taking a vaccination against the growing Coronavirus. Please be advised that the Holy See has recently stated that "All vaccines recognized as clinically safe & effective can be used in good conscience.... The morality of vaccination depends not only on the duty to protect one's health, but to pursue the common good." Therefore, it's not only about taking the vaccine to protect ourselves, but to help protect others as well. That's why we have a moral responsibility to get vaccinated...for the common good. That's also why I have a moral responsibility to encourage getting a vaccination, not to grant a religious exemption from the vaccination.

I do, however, know of someone who cannot take the vaccine because of a severe allergy to one or some of the components that go into the vaccine. That person easily has a medical exemption and a logical reason not to take the vaccine. Nonetheless, that person also has a moral obligation to do what they can, as much as possible, to keep from getting or spreading the Coronavirus...again, for the good of the self and for the common good. That means keeping social distancing and wearing a mask in public.

This past Wednesday, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, made the following appeal to all people of good will. Here is the official text:

"In a brotherly spirit, I join in this message of hope for a brighter future. Thanks to God and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from COVID-19. They grant us the hope of ending the pandemic, but only if they are available to all and if we work together.

"Being vaccinated with vaccines authorized by the competent authorities is an act of love. And contributing to ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love. Love for oneself, love for one's family and friends, love for all people. Love is social and political, there is social love and political love; it is universal, always overflowing with small gestures of personal charity capable of transforming and improving societies (cf. Laudato si', no 231, cf. Fratelli tutti, 184).

"Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most vulnerable. I pray to God that everyone may contribute their own small grain of sand, their own

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

#### Catholic Life Explained

**Question:** We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

Answer: The role of the Church in the world has taken different forms over time, but the theme is the same. Be disciples in it! As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, "In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we're there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!

#### Submission as Stewardship

We aren't comfortable with the idea of submission. Our society champions equality, and rightly so — but it's a mistake to think that submission is at odds with equality. To submit ourselves fully, we must first be free. We must first be our own masters. God has granted us that freedom with the salvation He offers. We are no longer the slaves of sin. Now He asks us to be subordinate to one another, in the name of Christ.

What a completely uncomfortable task! What He's asking is for us to be subordinate to the person who irritates us the most. The person we really can't stand. The person who doesn't respect us or appreciate what we have to offer. The person we think we're smarter than, more talented than. The person we envy.

That's the real challenge of stewardship, isn't it? Subordination. Inconveniencing myself by giving of time, of money, of relationship. Putting the needs or wants of another above my own when they haven't done anything special to earn it.

I invite you to consider the cross—the most radical expression of submission, and of stewardship, that ever existed. If there was ever someone who deserved superiority, isn't it the God who let Himself be nailed to a tree, who gave so freely of His life, His body, His blood, His everything?

To look at him in his agony is to truly understand the beauty of submission—of laying down what you have for the good of the other.

### PROGRESS ON THE ROOF

If you are afraid of heights, roofing is probably not the job for you. But for Commercial Roofers, Inc., it's just another day at the office for their workers as they scale the buildings throughout our campus replacing our 25 year old, deteriorated roof. They worked diligently through the months of June and July—covered from head to toe during some of the hottest days of the year—to ensure the school roof would be completed before the start of the new school year. Mission accomplished! They have since moved over to the parish hall, chapel and church to continue their work.

During the past 2 weeks, daily Mass was celebrated in the chapel while repairs were made on the church. Now they will proceed with replacing the damaged roof over the administrative offices. Replacement of a number of old, failing air conditiong units will take place in the weeks ahead.

Replacing the roof and irreparable air conditioning units throughout our property were two deferred maintenance needs identifed in our HONORING our PAST, EMBRACING our **FUTURE** Capital Campaign. To date, the three-year campaign has generated just over \$2.5 million in pledges toward our original \$4.5 million goal, and \$1.6 million of those pledges have been paid in full. Through campaign contributions and pledge payments we were able to pay off an \$820,000 construction loan last year—a goal our parishioners ranked as the highest priority of the campaign. Now we are focusing on the maintenance projects that were also designated as highpriority. It is good to see this work in progress. The overall cost of this current project is approximately \$1.5 million. Your continued pledge payments and support of our campaign will help ensure this project can be paid for without depleting our savings. Thank you for your generosity!


