

Dear Parishioners and Friends of SEAS,

DAYLIGHT SAVINGS ENDS NEXT WEEKEND!

Even though we gain an hour by changing our clocks back one hour next Saturday before going to bed, I wish we would get rid of this back and forth changing of times twice each year and forget this Daylight Savings Time system. I don't like the fact that it will get darker earlier. I don't like being out of sync with my family and friends in Arizona.

Nonetheless, enjoy the extra hour next weekend! I know most of us treasure the gift of that little bit of extra time!

"CATHOLIC" OR "NOT CATHOLIC"?

In the Church world, confusion can run rampant trying to figure out if something is really "Catholic" or "not Catholic." Please be careful, especially when trying to make certain decisions. For example, in the Las Vegas area, if you would like to know whether a particular church which might even have the word "catholic" in its title is Catholic or not, simply go to the website of our Archdiocese of Las Vegas (www.lvcatholic.org) and click the tab entitled "Parishes." Under that tab you will find a listing of "Schismatic Communities" which lists those organizations that are not in union with the Holy See nor the Roman Catholic Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Las Vegas (there are now 11 of them!). A most recent addition is the Santuario San Benito or Shrine of St. Benedict just begun this month by the laicized former priest, Mr. Adam Kotas. A reminder: those who attend these schismatic communities DO NOT fulfill their Sunday or Holy Day Obligations to attend Mass!

Likewise, during this current election season, you might see things either in print, on the web or in social media, which claim to have some "Catholic" authority behind them. You might have seen or heard of the Wisconsin Catholic Tribune, or even the Nevada Catholic Tribune (or any other Catholic Tribune from any other state for that matter!), which has absolutely no connection with the Roman Catholic Church! The same is true of many online presences as well. **Be aware: just because the word "Catholic" is in the title of a particular organization or publication does not automatically mean that it speaks on behalf of nor is it in alignment with the Roman Catholic Church!** Please note, in the political scenario, an easy way to tell if something is in union with the Roman Catholic Church or not is this: **The Catholic Church will never endorse any particular candidate or call for the victory or defeat of one political party over another. The Catholic Church does, however, speak out on moral issues and participates in debates over public policies.** You can certainly trust what you learn from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (www.usccb.org), especially in their document: Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility from the Catholic Bishops of the United States (www.faithfulcitizenship.org). For our Church here in the State of Nevada, please visit the website of the Nevada Catholic Conference (www.nevadacatholic.org) to get solid direction from our state's Bishops especially concerning matters affecting us all in Nevada.

In any case, regarding any other outlet that is openly partisan or endorses any particular candidate: you can be assured that they do not speak on behalf of the Roman Catholic Church. The fact remains that neither political party in the United States of America completely embraces all the moral teachings of the Catholic Church which is why it is difficult to make decisions based on a single issue! That is why we are to prayerfully consider all the options, weigh ALL the life issues, and make our voting decisions based on our own informed consciences. Bring your concerns sincerely before the Lord in prayer and make your informed decisions with a clear conscience.

I pray for all of us using the words of our Bishops from their document *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship:* "May God bless you as you consider and pray over these challenging decisions. May God bless our nation with true wisdom, peace, and mutual forgiveness, that we may decide together, through our democratic processes, to uphold the dignity of life and the common good."

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Venerable Anne de Guigné

Venerable Anne de Guigné (1911-1922) was born in Annecy-le-Vieux, Savoy, France to a wealthy family. She was the oldest child of four and by all accounts, a tyrant as a toddler. However, her early years were shadowed by the First World War. Her father was killed in action when she was just 4 years old. After her father's death, to comfort her mother, she became kind and obedient in everything.

Anne made her First Communion at just 6 years old, which at the time still required a special dispensation because she was so young. Anne had a profound understanding of Jesus' presence in the Holy Sacrament. She developed a strong personal relationship with Jesus. Whether in Mass, after Mass in prayer at the tabernacle, or at home, she declared that she loved to talk with "little Jesus." The grace of these prayerful conversations gave her a deep understanding of the reciprocal love between Jesus and his faithful.

When Anne was just 8 years old the first symptoms of the disease that would take her life appeared. But though her face was often disfigured from the pain, she offered her suffering as a sacrifice to God. She is attributed with saying, "we have many joys on earth, but they don't last; the one that lasts is to have made a sacrifice."

At just 10 years old, Anne died of meningitis. The cause for her sainthood was begun in 1932 and on March 3, 1990, she was declared venerable by Pope John Paul II. Venerable Anne de Guigné, pray for us!

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I'm amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

That's part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it's wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus' mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, "Master, let me receive my sight." Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can't see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can't see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let's cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we'll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.

PRACTICING CATHOLIC

The Safety of Darkness

Leprosy and blindness and deafness — oh, my. The disabilities cured by Jesus in his public ministry really are quite something, aren't they? Vividly symbolic and rich food for reflection. It just wouldn't be the same if Jesus had cured eczema or athlete's foot or compulsive nail-biting.

Blind Bartimaeus, sitting by the side of the road, in particular captures my imagination. Because I have a confession to make, sometimes, I like to sit in the darkness, even though I know it isn't very good for me.

Well, listen: it's just easier, isn't it? You don't have to care about or fix the problems you can't see. No one expects you to rush to someone's aid if you don't see their injuries. The darkness is a good place to be, if you don't feel very brave or very smart or very able.

And when Jesus passes you by, if your whole world is darkness, it's easy enough to pretend you just didn't notice him at all.

But Bartimaeus chose not to stay in his darkness. More than that, he cried out to be released from it, even when everyone around him told him to shut up. He was so persistent that he caught the notice of Jesus, and when he heard those words — "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you!" — what did he do? He didn't stammer and run away. He had courage. He got up.

It takes courage to ask for what you need to follow Christ. Because if you ask for it, you'll get it. And then begins the terrifying, wonderful journey of discipleship — testifying to what you have seen. Life in the light, no longer sitting by the side of the road but on the road, journeying toward the greatest destination of all.

"What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asks us. Do we have the courage to answer him?

A NEVADA CATHOLIC CONFERENCE ADVISORY VOTE <u>NO</u> ON QUESTION 6!

In Nevada's November 2024 general election, there is an abortion related ballot initiative that proposes to radically expand and enshrine abortion into our Nevada Constitution.

The Nevada Catholic Conference opposes this constitutional amendment and the ballot initiative seeking to permanently place the right to abortion in our state constitution. We urge you to vote NO on this dangerous initiative that threatens the dignity, safety and rights of women, children, and families for many reasons; among them:

- <u>It dangerously expands abortion rights</u>. Abortion, already legal in Nevada up to 24 weeks of pregnancy, would now be permitted to the 9th month of pregnancy, to full term.
- <u>It removes parental notification, consent, and family involvement</u> from all reproductive decisions for their minor children, including abortion. Parental consent is required to give a student an aspirin; yet this initiative would allow a minor to obtain an abortion without parental consent.
- <u>It eliminates the 'licensed physician' requirement for abortion</u> and substitutes 'health care practitioner' that could include nurses, physical therapists, dietitians, and athletic trainers (NRS 629.031) which would be dangerous to women in Nevada.

For these and many other reasons, the Nevada Catholic Conference urges all - <u>Vote NO on Question 6!</u>




